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After nearly five years on Queen St East, the Riverside BIA office moved this year to Street-car Studio, a beautiful, bright, spacious spot, accessible via Darkhorse Espresso.

It was fascinating to sift through 35+ years of files and relive memories and changes in Riverside since 1980 when it was established as the Queen Broadview Village BIA. The mandate was "to make direct, self-interested investments to improve their business as a group" by putting budget and effort together toward "collective promotion" as well as "joint business-community festivals" and "street improvements...making the area someplace proud to do business in and attractive to shop in."

Fast forward to the early 2000s: the BIA was relaunched as Riverside District BIA, to recognize its historic identity as "Riverside" since 1880. Iconic art was added in this theme and a neighbourhood revitalization was sparked. Today, the Riverside BIA serves much of the same function, to promote and beautify this unique neighbourhood. We host community events year round and work diligently to keep a good-looking and safe streetscape through vibrant street art projects,

planters, weekly graffiti removal service and extra maintenance throughout.

Mitch Korman, son of one of the founders of the BIA, Jack Korman, has been the BIA's dedicated Chair for over 10 years and all board members continue to work together to make Riverside an exciting place to work, live, and play. Some of the original businesses remain - such as George's Broadview Beauty Parlour since 1963 and Ron's Elbers Antiques since 1985 - while many have changed dramatically - just look at the Broadview Hotel!

There's no shortage of places to savour the flavour of fresh brewed coffee in Riverside.

Whether you prefer fair trade, filtered, mochas, macchiatos, or simply enjoy the atmosphere of an eclectic cafe, Riverside is rich in coffee culture, each shop having a unique take on the meaning of coffee. Here are just a few of Riverside's hidden and not-so hidden gems:

The Merchants of Green Coffee

"Merchants of Green Coffee is my neighbourhood gem of a java house," says Toronto fashion designer Leon Oziel.

"It's comfortable like an old favourite t-shirt."Located at 2 Matilda Street in an 18,000 sq ft warehouse and former jam factory, slightly off the beaten



path, Merchants of Green is **Darkhorse Espresso** rustic and relaxing, filled with antique tables, chairs, and furniture crafted with recycled metal.

Merchants Green of specializes in trading green coffee beans, hosts educational coffee workshops, events and special projects year-round.

Leon describes Merchants of Green as a throw back to the original 80s-style coffee house.

unique aesthetics, With philosophies, practices and specialties, every cafe attracts its own kind of connoisseur. Some savour a simple slow drip while others go for the pull.

"I frequent coffee houses that do not just push a button to create an Americano," says Robert Farmer, a house painter in Riverside. "I like to see the barista take the artisanal approach; grinding the beans, weighing it, and making a great tasting beverage."

Robert says he avoids places that do up-selling as it removes the laid back interpersonal approach he prefers.

While Merchants of Green has a subdued vibe, one that makes you want to grab your favourite book and spend the afternoon sipping coffee on one of their oversized couches, just across the park, Darkhorse Espresso on Queen Street East has a totally different scene.

The first thing you'll notice is their bright atmosphere and huge wooden communal table, which makes it easy to strike up a conversation and meet new people in the neighbourhood.

It's a networking haven with, perhaps even better than the fair weather. coffee here, is the excellent customer service.

Why did you decide to start GoodHood?

GoodHood had its beginnings in an ongoing email thread with friends and neighbours sharing local things to do, hot new restaurants and tidbits from the hood. One of the most exciting changes to the Riverside community in decades is the restoration and unveiling of the revitalized Broadview Hotel, located at the busy corner of Broadview Avenue and Queen Street East.

This 1800s building, which has an exterior made of brick, sandstone and terracotta, with the rare architectural feature of a pyramidal tower roof, has been meticulously restored and re-imagined as a 58-room boutique hotel and charismatic gathering spot.

The revitalized Broadview Hotel is just the latest development in the building's long and unique history. Known for the past few decades simply as Jilly's, The Broadview Hotel was originally built in 1891 as a Romanesque style hall for Archibald Dingman (known as Dingman's Hall) for public gatherings. By 1907, an owner-

ship change resulted in it being converted to a hotel with rooming houses for men working in factories or on the rail lines around Toronto. For a short time it was known as the Lincoln Hotel. The building continued to change over the years and by 1986, the lower level had been converted to an adult club, Jilly's, with rooming houses above, and remained so for decades.

In 2014, Streetcar Developments bought the building and began its transition. In the same year, The Broadview Hotel was officially designated a heritage building. On October 5th, 2016, The Broadview Hotel's lighted exterior was unveiled to much fanfare.

An innovative feature of The Broadview Hotel includes a cafe and bar serving breakfast,



sandwiches and coffee during the day, which then transforms into a champagne and cocktail bar at night. Located across the lobby is the Civic, a restaurant helmed by executive chef John Sinopoli and Erik Joyal, who also runs Riverside's Hi-Lo bar, as well as Ascari Enoteca and Gare de L'est in neighbouring Leslieville. The Civic offers whole roasts, game birds, offal and more. A 3,000 sq ft event space, the Lincoln Hall and 1,000 sq.ft. terrace are located on the second floor.

On the top floor is the glass-enclosed Rooftop restaurant with indoor and outdoor patio offering beautiful views and an incredible skylight. This space includes a "New Broadview Hotel" sign that used to hang outside the establishment. The Rooftop will offer light, seasonal dishes that are perfect to share among a group of friends.


The rooftop also showcases the Tower, a magnificent venue featuring exposed brick and wood, historic windows and a grand vaulted ceiling. The space will be available for private events such as seated dinners for 20 or cocktail receptions for 30.

Keep an eye out for little bits of the history and personality of the building that have been retained, such as wallpaper in selected bathrooms that feature pin-up girls, a reference to Jilly's.

On top of its incredible design and features, The Broadview Hotel also includes nods to Riverside and larger east end Toronto community. Apart from the décor pieces, each room has curated vinyl record collections from Riverside's own Tiny Record Shop, as well luxury toiletries from Riverdale-based Graydon Skincare. In fact, the restoration of The Broadview Hotel has taken into consideration the rich history of the building and the Riverside community. We spoke to Murray Henderson, The Broadview Hotel's General Manager:

What makes this hotel unique?

Its location: it's the first hotel east of the Don Valley, first Hotel on the cultural and programming side, east of Yonge Street.



We are changing the landscape here. It's a hotel that is designed and created on the concept of enhancing the neighbourhood it's rooted in.

What makes this hotel speak to the history of the community it's housed in?

All of the key players in the hotel are connected to the east end: myself and Les (president of Streetcar Developments) live in the east end, and Erik and John (The Broadview Hotel's restauranteur) are pioneers of culinary establishments operating in the east end. The hotel's whole operation in the east end gives opportunities for local people to form partnerships and enhance what's going on in the community.

How does it connect with modern life in Riverside?

There's a lot of modern applications of traditional elements in the hotel: when you look at the building itself there's the rooftop glass space, and the overall space inside feels more on the contemporary side. It's literally a new building inside an old skin. We were able to bring new life and the type of technology - such as streaming your own content on TV in your room- that the modern hotel traveller is looking for. The concept of travellers wanting to get into the culture of the city they are travelling in, that's what The Broadview Hotel is offering.


What was the most surprising thing you discovered about the hotel in this process?

The most delightful thing we discovered was the community support: people reaching out and asking how they can help and get involved. I've opened a number of hotels and have never seen that before, it's pretty motivating and energizing for us as a team.



Anything else to share?

I could talk for hours, but just wanted to say that I personally am really excited to be both a community member and the General Manager. Our team is excited to welcome the community and beyond to The Broadview Hotel so we can bring the building to life.






Who's Who in the Hood

What's All the Buzz About?

One of the neighbourhood's newest local landmarks is the Riverside Pollinator Mural on the west facing wall of 777 Queen St East. The mural was a collaboration between property owner Ron Elbers, lot owner Vivienne Ziner, and the Riverside BIA, with funding from the City of Toronto. The Mural Artist, Nick Sweetman, is an independent, multi-disciplinary artist, living in Riverside. His mural design speaks to three Riverside themes: 1) it continues the 'Time and a Clock' art theme by Eldon Garnet seen along Queen East, 2) at the same time it pays homage to one of Riverside BIA founders, watchmaker Albert Edelstein, and 3) it speaks to the hidden treasures of Riverside including natural spaces and bee hives.
